Why is Indonesia in the news?

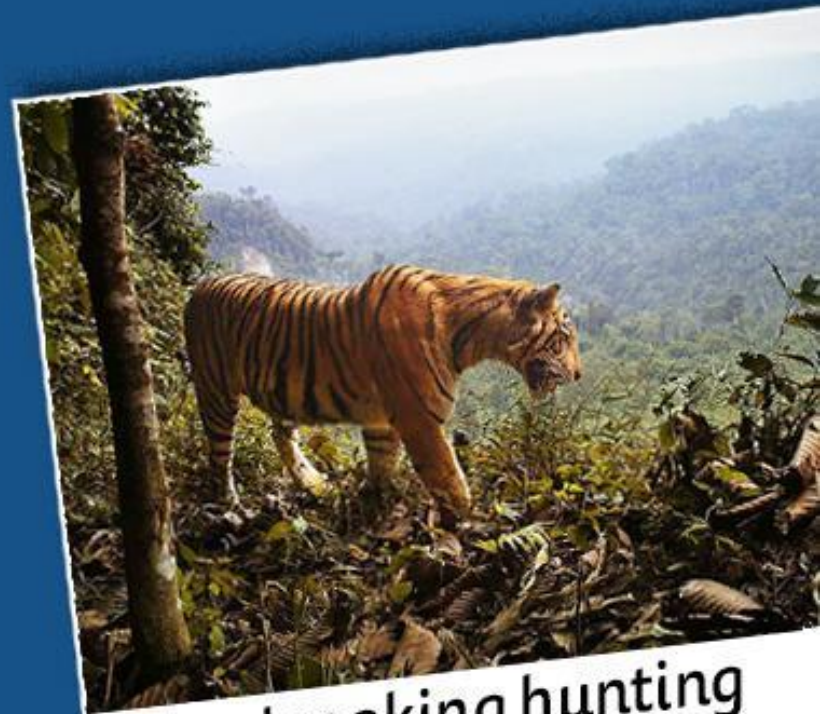
Because there were only 3,200 tigers left in the wild in 2010 and the 12-year project aiming to double this number is due to come to an end this year.
